



I asked Claudia how she felt afterward and she was in a really good mood and said she didn't mind losing to her friend because she has been wrestling for so many years. That made sense, but what she said next surprised me; "I'd rather wrestle her every match and lose but know I am getting better than wrestle against girls I know I can beat and win."

For a majority of my life I have always wanted to finish on top. Whether it was grades, sports, or even now comparing sermons to those of colleagues, I've wanted to be better, or at least feel like I'm better, than those around me. I'm embarrassed to even type that sentence, but it is true. There is this competitive nature I have that seems to be ingrained in all I do. I see this as a flaw in my character where my ego gets in the way and leaves no room for the Spirit to be at work.

This season of Epiphany in which we find ourselves is all about the spreading of the light of God that has come into this world in Christ. The message of who he is and what it means to us is spreading. For some of us, like myself, it's about that light reaching into the darkest corners of our being.

I believe my tendencies to want to always win and come out in front stem from a desire to feel important or that I matter. Epiphany's message is that we all matter. God's light, God's love, doesn't discriminate, it shines on all people equally. That's why the story of the wise men coming to see Jesus was so important. There were no boundaries or borders that could contain God's love.

What that means for me is that I can stop trying to compete with others and think I need to come out on top. All I need to do is rest assured that God's love and compassion is all around me. May I continue to grow in my faith and trust in God, and know that even when, and perhaps especially when, I finish second, third, or even last in anything I am just as important in God's eyes. 


